

Fieldhead Carr Primary Equality Statement

Fieldhead Carr recognises its legal obligations as set out in The Equality Act 2010 and under the Public Sector Equality Duties. The Equality Act 2010 requires the School to:

- eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under the Act;
- advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it (i.e. tackle prejudice and promote understanding).

The Act defines 'having regard to the advancement of equality of opportunity' as having due regard, in particular, to the need to:

- remove or minimise disadvantages suffered by pupils who share a relevant protected characteristic that are connected to that characteristic;
- take steps to meet the needs of pupils who share a relevant protected characteristic that are different from the needs of persons who do not share it; and
- encourage pupils who share a relevant protected characteristic to participate in public life or in any other activity in which participation by such persons is disproportionately low.

The Schools has appropriate policies in place to support our legal obligations ¹, as well as an Equality Action Plan to ensure that the school continues to place equality at the heart of our pupils learning.

The School seeks to go beyond its legal responsibilities and strives to bring fairness, equity and harmony into the school environment. We are an inclusive community and we recognise that everyone is unique and has their own potential. Our approach therefore goes beyond just our legislative requirements and is one of Recognising Equality, Celebrating Diversity and Encouraging Inclusion.
