

Pupil Premium Grant Spending Statement 2015-2016

Objectives in spending PPG to narrow the gap in achievement between pupils eligible for PPG and their peer group:

- To improve the attendance of pupils
- To enhance learning opportunities
- To enrich the curriculum
- To increase parental/carer engagement
- To provide additional targeted support for lowest and highest achievers
- To continue to embed whole school strategies to promote self-regulation and meta cognition
- To continue to provide provision to raise engagement and aspirations of families
- To develop social and emotional skills

Targeted pupils (all eligible pupils/group/cohort/individual):

- Individuals
- Small groups
- Year groups
- All eligible pupils

Provision:

- Literacy, Maths, Social, Emotional and Behaviour interventions for small groups and individual targeted pupils
- A Nurturing Group for targeted pupils (staff and resources)
- Family Learning courses
- Access to outside provision such as soft play and Donkey Riding for targeted pupils
- Higher ratio of adult to child support for targeted pupils
- Training to up skill existing support staff
- Subsidised Educational visits/visitors for targeted pupils
- 'Wraparound' childcare for targeted pupils
- Homework club
- Uniform allowance for targeted pupils
- Music lessons from a peripatetic teacher
- Support for parents of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium

Outcomes and impact to date:

- Generally, there is an upward trend in attainment, APS and achievement being made by pupils eligible for FSM over the last five years.
- With regard to Achievement, 'pupils making expected progress or more' is a positive picture for FSM pupils with either no gap or a gap in favour of FSM pupils.

Process for monitoring impact:

- Standardised testing
- Attendance data
- Academic data
- Subscription to parent courses
- Pupil/teacher questionnaires
